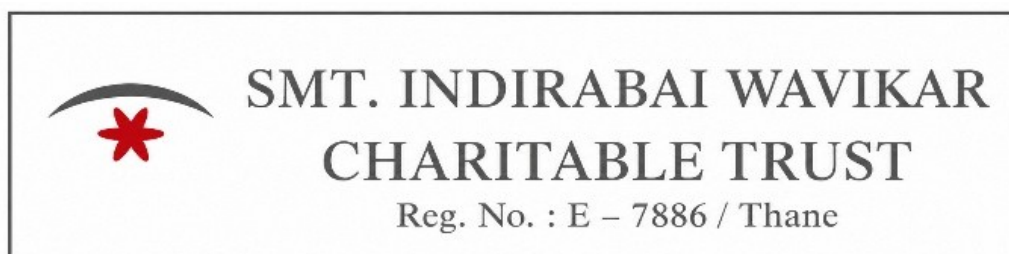

A reflection on the year of community eye-care service



Message from the Chairman

The year 2010–2011 reflects our continued commitment to taking eye-care services closer to the community. Through 15 eye camps, 1,929 patients were screened and 342 cataract surgeries were facilitated. Of these, 41 surgeries were provided free of cost and 301 were provided on a subsidised basis. The Trust also distributed 96 spectacles and screened 991 school children.

These figures represent more than numbers: they reflect people reached, vision restored and opportunities created for healthier and more independent lives. We remain grateful to our patients, medical teams, volunteers, supporters and well-wishers whose cooperation made these activities possible.

As we look ahead, we aim to strengthen community outreach, improve access to timely eye care and continue serving those who need support.

The above figures are based on the 2010–2011 data supplied for this annual report.

Major Activity: Community Eye Camps

During 2010–2011, the Trust conducted 15 eye camps as part of its community outreach efforts. These camps provided an opportunity for people to receive eye screening and guidance closer to their communities.

Key outcome: 1,929 patients were screened through the reported eye-camp activities.



Major Activity: Cataract Services

Cataract care formed a major component of the year's reported service activity. A total of 342 cataract surgeries were recorded during 2010–2011.

Access to Care: Free & Subsidised Surgeries

The 2010–2011 figures show a strong emphasis on financial access to cataract treatment. Out of 342 cataract surgeries, 41 were free and 301 were subsidised.

342 = 41 free + 301 subsidised

Vision Support: Spectacles Distribution

The Trust distributed 96 spectacles during 2010–2011, supporting individuals who required vision correction identified through its outreach and screening activities.



Major Activity: School Eye Screening

School eye screening was another important outreach component. During 2010–2011, 991 school children were screened.

The activity helped bring attention to vision needs among children and created an opportunity for early identification of eye-related concerns.

Community Outreach & Awareness

The reported eye camps and school screening activities demonstrate an outreach-oriented approach to eye health. The year's programme focused on bringing screening closer to communities and identifying people who could benefit from further eye care.



Education, Training & Learning

The annual-report template includes education, training and innovation as a core section. For 2010–2011, no specific programme statistics were supplied in the source data.
