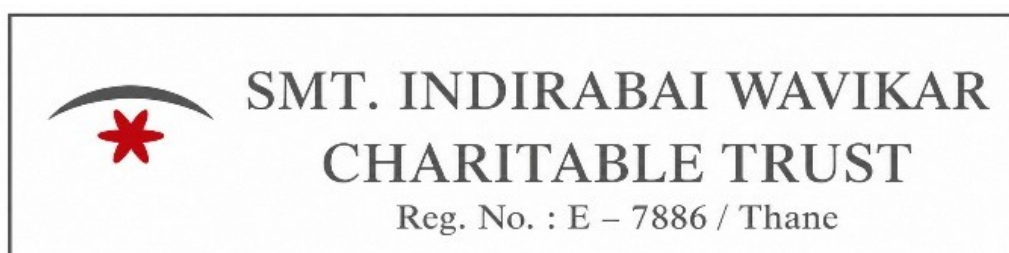

Message from the Chairman

It is my privilege to present the Annual Report of Smt. Indirabai Wavikar Charitable Trust for the year 2011-2012. This report reflects our continued commitment to delivering compassionate, accessible, and high-quality eye care while making a meaningful difference in the communities we serve.

During the year, the Trust strengthened its outreach through 56 eye screening camps, reaching 8,283 patients. We also facilitated 397 cataract surgeries, including 58 free surgeries and 339 subsidised surgeries. In addition, 102 spectacles were distributed and 2,956 school children were screened.

These achievements are a reflection of the dedication of our medical teams, staff, volunteers, supporters and community partners. Every screening, treatment and intervention represents an opportunity to prevent avoidable vision loss and improve quality of life.

Indirabai Wavikar Charitable Trust is a registered public charitable trust (Registration No. E-7805/Thane) dedicated to providing accessible, affordable, and high-quality eye care to all sections of society. Major Activity: Community Eye Camps

The Trust organised 56 community eye camps during 2011–2012. These outreach activities supported the early identification of eye-care needs and helped bring screening services closer to the community. A total of 8,283 patients were screened through the reported activities.



Major Activity: Cataract Services

Cataract services remained an important part of the Trust's charitable eye-care work. During 2011–2012, a total of 397 cataract surgeries were recorded.

Free and subsidised services helped extend access to sight-restoring cataract treatment.



Access to Care: Free & Subsidised Surgeries

The year's cataract surgery figures demonstrate the Trust's focus on affordability and access. Of the 397 cataract surgeries, 58 were free and 339 were subsidised.

397 = 58 free + 339 subsidised



Vision Support: Spectacles Distribution

The Trust distributed 102 spectacles during 2011-2012. This activity supported individuals identified as requiring vision correction through screening and outreach.



Major Activity: School Vision Screening

School vision screening was an important preventive eye-health activity. During 2011-2012, 2,956 school children were screened.

School screening creates an opportunity to identify vision problems early and guide children and families towards appropriate eye care.



Awareness & Special Outreach

The Trust's outreach approach focuses on taking eye-care services closer to communities and encouraging timely attention to vision problems. The 56 eye camps and school screening of 2,956 children form the key reported outreach activities for 2011–2012.



Education, Training & Innovation

Education and capacity building are integral to strengthening community eye care. The Trust's annual-report framework includes education, training and innovation as areas supporting its mission.

For this 2011-2012 report, no separate quantitative education or training statistics were supplied. This page is therefore reserved for verified activities such as student programmes, clinical training, workshops, awareness sessions, research or innovation undertaken during the year.
