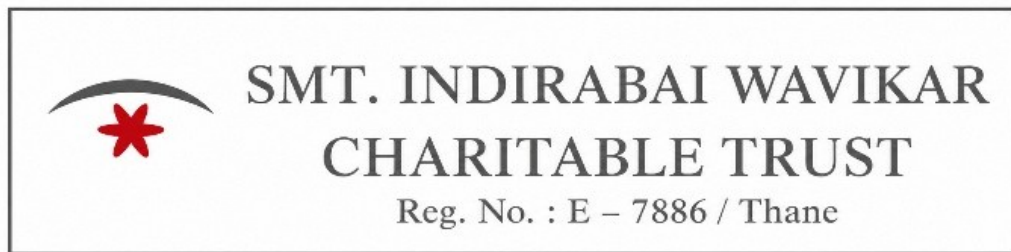

Message from the Chairman

It is my privilege to present the Annual Report of Smt. Indirabai Wavikar Charitable Trust for the year 2014-2015. This report reflects our continued commitment to compassionate, accessible and high-quality eye care and our efforts to reach communities with timely screening and treatment.

During the year, the Trust conducted 111 eye camps and screened 17,948 patients. Cataract care remained a major area of service, with 605 cataract surgeries recorded, including 156 free surgeries and 449 subsidised surgeries. The Trust also distributed 238 spectacles and screened 7,444 school children.

These figures represent the combined efforts of our doctors, healthcare professionals, staff, volunteers, donors, community partners and well-wishers. Every patient screened and every treatment supported contributes to the larger goal of preventing avoidable vision loss and improving quality of life.

We remain grateful to the communities we serve for their trust and to everyone who supports the Trust's charitable eye-care mission. We look forward to strengthening outreach, education, partnerships and patient-centred care in the years ahead.

About the Trust

Established in 2012, Smt. Indirabai Wavikar Charitable Trust is a registered public charitable trust (Registration No. E-7805/Thane) dedicated to providing accessible, affordable and high-quality eye care to all sections of society. Guided by the belief that every patient deserves the best possible eye care, the Trust works to prevent avoidable blindness, restore vision and improve quality of life through comprehensive eye-care services and community outreach.

The Trust's annual-report framework focuses on community eye camps, cataract services, diabetic retinopathy and glaucoma screening, school screening, awareness programmes, special outreach, education and training, partnerships and charitable support.

Major Activity: Community Eye Camps

During 2014–2015, the Trust continued its community outreach through eye screening camps. A total of 111 eye camps were conducted during the year, through which 17,948 patients were screened.

The camps provided an important platform for screening, counselling, early identification of eye conditions and referral for further evaluation or treatment where required.



Major Activity: Cataract Services

Cataract services remained a major component of the Trust's charitable eye-care work. During 2014–2015, a total of 605 cataract surgeries were recorded.

Free and subsidised services helped extend access to sight-restoring cataract treatment for patients requiring financial support.





Access to Care: Free & Subsidised Surgeries

The 2014–2015 cataract surgery figures demonstrate the Trust's focus on affordability and access. Of the 605 cataract surgeries, 156 were free and 449 were subsidised.

605 = 156 free + 449 subsidised



Vision Support: Spectacles Distribution

The Trust distributed 238 spectacles during 2014–2015. Spectacle distribution supported individuals identified as requiring vision correction through screening and outreach.

Major Activity: School Vision Screening

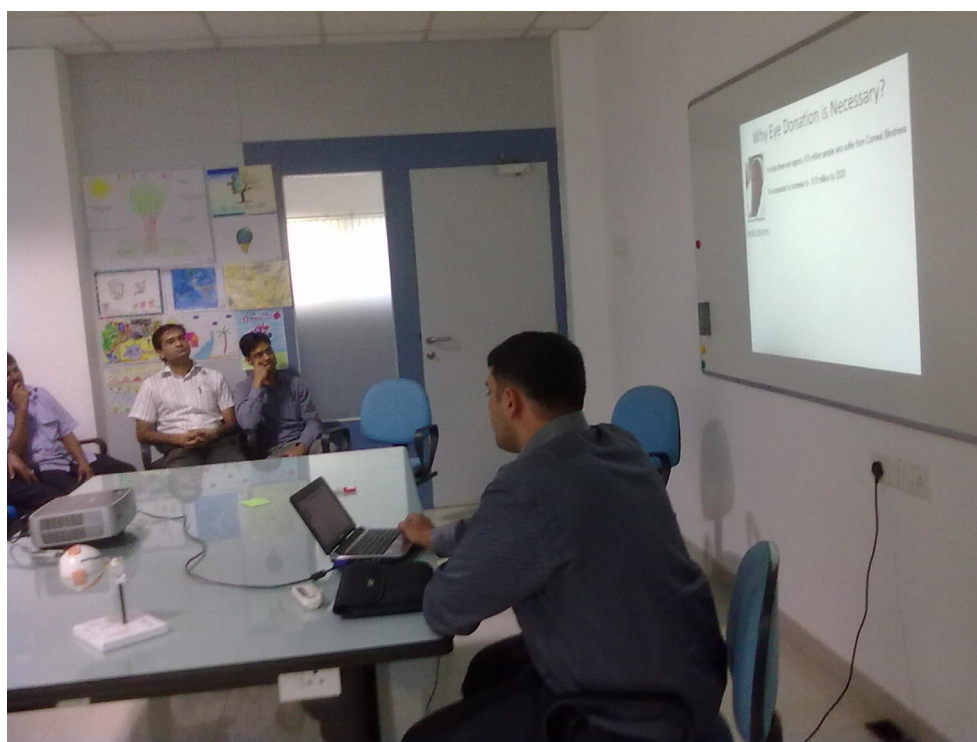
School vision screening was an important preventive eye-health activity during 2014–2015. A total of 7,444 school children were screened.

School screening provides an opportunity for early identification of vision problems and appropriate counselling, referral and follow-up. It also supports awareness of healthy vision among children, parents and schools.



Major Activity: Diabetic Retinopathy & Glaucoma Screening

The reference annual-report format identifies diabetic retinopathy screening and glaucoma screening as important community eye-health activities. These programmes support early detection, counselling and timely intervention.



Awareness & Special Outreach Initiatives

The Trust's reference framework includes awareness programmes covering regular eye examinations, preventive eye care, diabetes-related eye diseases, glaucoma, cataracts and childhood vision care. Special outreach is intended to extend services to vulnerable and underserved populations through community and institutional collaboration.



Education, Training & Innovation

Education and capacity building are integral to strengthening community eye care. The reference report highlights the role of Wavikar College of Optometry in developing skilled eye-care professionals through academic learning and clinical exposure.

The reference framework also includes practical learning through community eye screening camps, clinical postings, school eye-health initiatives, rural outreach, continuing education programmes, workshops, seminars and guest lectures, together with research, evidence-based practice and public awareness.
