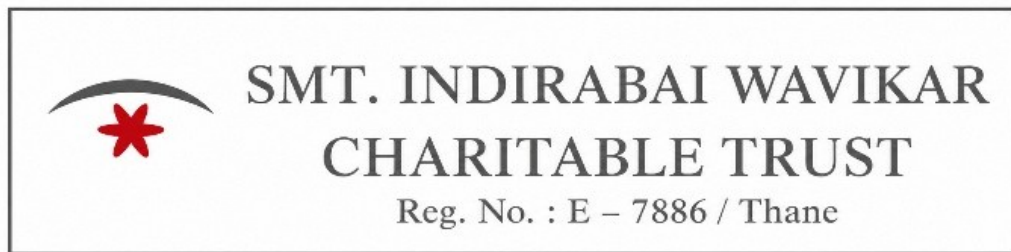

Message from the Chairman

It is my privilege to present the Annual Report of Smt. Indirabai Wavikar Charitable Trust for the year 2017-2018. This report reflects our continued commitment to compassionate, accessible and high-quality eye care and our efforts to reach communities with timely screening and treatment.

During the year, the Trust conducted 189 eye camps and screened 23,139 patients. Cataract care remained a major area of service, with 965 cataract surgeries recorded, including 272 free surgeries and 693 subsidised surgeries. The Trust also distributed 271 spectacles and screened 12,034 school children.

These achievements represent the combined efforts of our doctors, healthcare professionals, staff, volunteers, donors, community partners and well-wishers. Every screening and treatment supported the wider objective of preventing avoidable vision loss and improving quality of life.

We remain grateful to the communities we serve for their trust and to everyone who contributes to the Trust's charitable eye-care mission. We look forward to strengthening outreach, education, partnerships and patient-centred care in the years ahead.

The above figures are the activity statistics supplied for the year 2017–2018.

Major Activity: Community Eye Camps

During 2017–2018, the Trust continued its community outreach through eye screening camps. A total of 189 eye camps were conducted during the year, through which 23,139 patients were screened.

These outreach activities provided opportunities for eye screening, counselling and identification of patients requiring further evaluation or treatment. Community camps helped take eye-care services closer to people and supported early identification of eye conditions.



Major Activity: Cataract Services

Cataract care remained a major component of the Trust's charitable eye-care work. During 2017–2018, a total of 965 cataract surgeries were recorded.

Free and subsidised surgeries helped ensure that financial constraints did not prevent patients from receiving sight-restoring treatment.



Access to Care: Free & Subsidised Surgeries

The 2017–2018 cataract surgery figures demonstrate the Trust's emphasis on affordability and access. Of the 965 cataract surgeries, 272 were free and 693 were subsidised.

965 = 272 free + 693 subsidised



Vision Support: Spectacles Distribution

The Trust distributed 271 spectacles during 2017–2018. This activity supported individuals identified as requiring vision correction through screening and outreach.

Major Activity: School Vision Screening

School vision screening continued as an important preventive eye-health activity during 2017–2018. A total of 12,034 school children were screened.

The programme supported early identification of vision problems, counselling and referrals where required. School screening also helped promote better visual health and awareness among children and families.



Major Activity: Diabetic Retinopathy & Glaucoma Screening

The reference annual-report framework identifies diabetic retinopathy and glaucoma screening as important community eye-health activities, with a focus on early detection, counselling and timely intervention.



Awareness & Special Outreach Initiatives

The reference report describes awareness initiatives covering regular eye examinations, preventive eye care, diabetes-related eye diseases, glaucoma, cataracts and childhood vision care. Special outreach is intended to extend services to vulnerable and underserved populations through community and institutional collaboration.



Education, Training & Innovation

Education and capacity building are integral to strengthening community eye care. The reference report highlights the role of Wavikar College of Optometry in developing skilled eye-care professionals through academic learning and clinical exposure.

The reference framework includes practical learning through community eye screening camps, clinical postings, school eye-health initiatives, rural outreach, continuing education programmes, workshops, seminars and guest lectures, together with research, evidence-based practice and public awareness.

Partnerships & Community Support

The reference annual-report framework recognises partnerships with NGOs, CSR partners, government agencies, educational institutions, Lions, Rotary and other collaborating organisations as important to expanding the Trust's reach and impact.
